<u>This month's program:</u> In honor of Native American Heritage Month, this month's program consists of two videos on Navajo fiber traditions.

(1) Fiber Preparation and Spinning on a Navajo Spindle with TahNibaa Naataanii. TahNibaa Naataanii (Nah-TAH-nee) of Golden Navajo Churro Sheep Corral brings us the sights, sounds, songs, and stories of tending, proparing, and spinning bor flock's fiber in the way that her appostors

taught her. Naataanii tends a flock of Navajo Churro in a range of stunning natural colors and transforms their fleeces into fiber, felt, yarn, and both traditional and modern weavings. In this video, Ms. Naataanii (Nah- TAH-nee) demonstrates carding churro wool and spinning it on a Navajo spindle while singing a traditional Navajo (Diné - din-EH) song. She talks about the tradition of Navajo weaving, spindles, and looms. At the end she briefly shows a few of her weavings. 20 ½ min

From the President's Desk

This year's officer elections are for the President and Secretary positions. Both Nicole (Secretary) and myself (President) agreed to continue on in our current roles, so no nomination committee was convened. In the event that anyone else wishes to run for either of the positions, there will be an opportunity at the November 13th meeting to add your name to the slate of officers. Voting for officers will be held similarly to how it was conducted for the recent proposal to apply for state incorporation. A link to vote will be sent to membership following Saturday's guild meeting. Voting will close approximately one week after Saturday's guild meeting.

Also, the results of the incorporation vote will be announced on Saturday, so join us for the meeting if you want to hear the result announced live.

Membership & Dues

As of 10/29/21, 34 members have paid their 2022 dues. Our guild currently has 54 members, including Liberty Town.

Dues (\$30 annually, \$15 out of state & youth/student \$5) are currently being collected and were due by September 30. Members who do not submit their dues by December 30th will be removed from the guild's membership rolls.

Payment is possible by PayPal but <u>please</u> follow these instructions or PayPal will keep a portion of your money rather than crediting all of it to the guild:

- 1. Go to PayPal.com and login. You may need to click on the "MyPayPal" icon to get to the money dashboard.
- 2. Click on the "Send" icon.
- 3. In the box asking for a name or email address for where you want the money to go, enter the guild's email address: fswguild@gmail.com
- 4. Type in the amount of money you want to send.
- 5. In the "notes" box, enter in what the money is for, such as "donation", "August rent", or "annual guild dues".
- 6. Click on "continue".
- 7. When it asks what the payment is for, choose sending to a friend.
- 8. Scroll until you can see the "Send Payment/Money Now" button and click on it.

MAFA update

<u>Upcoming MAFA RoundTable Meeting</u> - MAFA invites ALL guild members to join in the next MAFA roundtable on Tuesday, November 23 at 7 pm. The Francis Irwin Handweavers Guild will present their MAFA grant, Linen, the Journey from Seed to Cloth. Learn about their whole process: planting, harvesting, preparing the flax for spinning, spinning, and finally, weaving.

Also, the Fall MAFA representative meeting was held 10/26/21. New officers were recently elected and their names/positions/bios can be found on the MAFA site. Treasurer's report shows a bank balance of \$249339.51. Currently, a scheduled financial review with an auditor is in progress and anticipated to be complete by mid-December. Profit from last June's conference was \$61410.00, which far exceeded expectations. Survey results from 261 participants were overwhelmingly positive and all survey responses will be utilized by the 2023 Conference Committee to inform upcoming decisions.

That said, planning for the 2023 Conference is already beginning.

Volunteers who are computer savvy are sorely needed - please contact Carol Steuer at <u>conference@mafafiber.org</u> if you can lend a hand. Also, if you have suggestions for in-person instructors, please let <u>Aileen</u> know and she will send it along.

Grants: early deadline is November 1, regular deadline is January 10. Details and application are on the <u>MAFA website</u>.

Currently MAFA is reviewing its dues structure as well as discussing whether to continue with the 50% reduction due to the pandemic. (Restructuring would not affect our guild's dues to MAFA.)

Currently, there are 54 member guilds active in MAFA, as well as 225 associate members.

One of MAFA's perks to member guilds is the ability to host guild websites. Guilds must purchase the domain name but otherwise, MAFA absorbs the cost and most of the tasks of maintaining a guild website.

Next MAFA representative meeting will be in May, 2022 (very likely virtual, though there may be an informal rep meet-up at MD Sheep and Wool)

Favorite Scandinavian Projects to Weave 45 stylish designs for the modern home By Tina Ignell -Scandinavian Weaving Magazine

I was taking a cotton spinning class at Red Stone Glen and, of course, made time to go shopping. I love Scandinavian weaving so this book just jumped off the shelf into my basket. The book is lovely to look at, with full page photos of each project and excellent directions and drafts for each. It has projects for 2 shafts up to 10 shafts, simple plain weave and twill to overshot and damask, for all levels of weavers. There are lace curtains and simple color and weave kitchen towels, blankets and pillows and even a hammock for an ambitious weaver. There is a good table of contents and an index listing projects by number of shafts and a small list of suppliers. The drafts are in the Swedish style but are easy to read – you see the threading at the bottom, the tie up in the right hand bottom corner and the treadling goes up the righthand side.

I am looking forward to weaving several projects from this lovely book.

Articles/New Products/Tips, Tricks, or Hacks

This month's tips, shared by Judy Klehm, come from the Weavers Guild of Boston and from Nimble Needles Website

Weavers' Wisdom

In order to get even lengths of warp ends when using a warping mill, wind on each new end above the last going in one direction, and underneath when returning.

To maintain even tension and to minimize twist when chaining a warp, pull the threads through the loop with alternate hands.

Knitting Knotes

RIPPING STOCKINETTE STITCH

To rip back many rows in stockinette stitch, take a thinner needle and run it under the front leg of every stitch on the row below the mistake. Then just rip away. The ripping stops when you get to the needle, and all the stitches are set correctly so you can resume knitting after transferring them to the right size needle. If you're using circular needles either end is ready to knit.

SIMPLIFIED SWATCH NOTES

Instead of recording the needle size used for your knitting swatch on a paper label, tie an appropriate number of knots in the tail of the yarn left over from casting on. - 7 knots means needle size 7.
