The second grant program, titled "Gateway to Weaving" provided the guild with 6 rigid heddle looms which were used to teach free workshops on beginning weaving, as well as conduct multiple outreach activities to expose and introduce a wide variety of community members to weaving. Notably, the guild continues to hold workshops and do outreach using the rigid heddle looms and those workshops are always full - their grant year ended two years ago! The guild can also attribute 11 new members to the guild as a result of the rigid heddle beginning weaving program





## Book Highlight

Knitting Tips and Trade Secrets

This little booklet was published through Threads magazine in 1969. It is 119 pages of interesting tips dealing with everything related to knitting and crocheting including topics like yarns, multicolor knitting, garment tips, machine knitting and finishing techniques to name a few. Each of the tips or techniques are short and to the point, with some good illustrations.

The information has been contributed by knitters and crocheters from all over the United States and their names and locations are included. This adds a little interest and also lets you know that someone has actually tried and or used what is being recommended. This is a good book to keep handy. You can pick it up and read a couple of tips at a time. The ideas included are very helpful. Here is one example:

### Yarn Untangler

If your knitting yarn becomes tangled and hard to work with, spray it with Static Guard. Static Guard takes the kinks out of the yarn so it will knit or wind smoothly.

## Articles/New Products/Tips, Tricks, or Hacks

This month's tips, shared by Judy Klehm, come from the Weavers Guild of Boston and from Nimble Needles Website

### Weavers' Wisdom

When warping, particularly with a delicate yarn, add a few extra threads to the warp. Then when threading, let one of the extras fall back off the loom at intervals across the warp. Should a repair be necessary, the thread is already warped and ready to use.

### Knitting Knots

#### HOW TO MAKE THE LAST STITCH IN YOUR BIND OFF NEATER

Often the last stitch of a bind-off looks a bit weird. It forms this little ear and it's often a bit too loose. But there is a super-easy way to fix that.

**Step 1:** Instead of knitting the last stitch, slip it to your right needle.

**Step 2:** Pick up the back loop of the stitch one row below and lift it to your knitting needle.

**Step 3:** Slip both stitches back to the left needle.

**Step 4:** Knit these two stitches together.

**Step 5:** Bind off the remaining two stitches on your right needle as normal.

# A Weaver's Thoughts

Twill Combinations 4 shaft

This is the title of a section in the Davison book 'A Handweaver's Pattern Book' on pages 33 to 46. The patterns are twill that have been built upon or modified to make more complex patterns. Mostly these patterns were used for household goods. Davison suggests that weaving these patterns using linen for both warp and weft would be like making linens that could be of heirloom quality and they will improve with laundering.

Another good feature is these patterns need only 1 shuttle. Also, there are patterns that have more than one treadling for the threading. The best one for this is titled 'Weaver's Fancy'. It has 19 patterns with the same threading and tie-up!

# The Mourning Project

United Against Infant Mortality

From Mary Vanecke, who is running the Project: "My vision for [TheMourningProject.com](http://TheMourningProject.com) is that each of the infants lost in a given year will be remembered with a unique, handmade, heartfelt little elegy. I am asking the fiber art community to come together to make 23,000+ pairs of baby booties. This is the number of American infants who die every year. Whether sewn, knitted, felted, woven, or crocheted, I am asking for donations of handmade baby shoes in the colors of mourning: black, white, and gray. Gathered together, these small elegies will literally paint a compelling picture too big to ignore: a 38' by 38' image of a heart with baby feet inside. This image requires 14,000 pairs of white booties alone."
