Highlights are as follows:

Next Guild Roundtable (Open to All Guild Members) is a presentation by Melissa Weaver

Dunning, July 26 at 7 PM: Traditional Knitting from England, Ireland, Scotland, and the Shetland Islands. Many of the foundations of traditional knitting come to us from England, Ireland, and Scotland: Fishermen's ganseys, Aran cable knitting, Fair Isle multicolored patterned knitting and delicate Shetland lace. We will explore each of these traditions through images of garments and knitters, old and new. Melissa Weaver Dunning is an avid tartan & linen weaver, a skilled spinner and a compulsive knitter. She loves to share the history and context of traditional textile arts and to pass on the efficient techniques of time-honored skills. She lives in the beautiful Shenandoah Valley of Virginia. Melissa is also a traditional hand-weaver working on antique equipment to produce 18th and 19th century style textiles. She has had the great good fortune to study with Scottish master weaver and singer Norman Kennedy since 1980. She is dedicated to carrying on some of the wealth of tradition gleaned from this apprenticeship both in weaving and in music. This roundtable is open to all MAFA guild members.

2023 Conference Update - 42 workshops have been selected from more than 130 proposals for the 2023 MAFA Conference!

Changes to MAFA By-Laws (more details can be found here)

There are two simple bylaws changes being proposed for adoption that reflect actual practices:

1) An update to make the meeting dates more flexible and reflect that we are having business meetings by video conference instead of requiring them to be in person.

2) An update to reflect that we actually have a compilation done which is sufficient for our situation, not a review which is more involved and costly. In accounting there are three tiers of service: compilation, review, and audit. Given our size and activities, we do not need a review or audit at this time.

Lessons/classes

Lori and Mary are seeking donations of fiber for their spinning classes that benefit the guild. In addition, if you have a wheel you are ready to sell, they are willing to demonstrate it to the students. There may be more than one person looking to purchase in the next few weeks.

So far, they have taught 6 new spinners, and there are two new students lined up for this Sunday. Two students have joined the guild so far. At least one wants to rent a wheel.

Spinning class has raised \$960 so far. All proceeds benefit the guild.

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WEAVERS' WISDOM

From The Weavers Guild of Boston

Fabrics woven in tabby are the strongest, but the stiffest and least insulating. They do not drape as well and crease more easily compared to other weaves used under the same conditions.

A stick shuttle will pass more easily through a shed if it is held on edge.

To keep a slippery yarn from unwinding too fast from the bobbin, fasten a bit of fur or fleece to the inside of the shuttle so that it just touches the weft as it passes from the shuttle.

KNITTING KNOTES

1. Create a neat edge with an easy chain slip stitch.

There are several ways to do a chain edge, but this is the easiest way I've found.

At the end of every row, slip the last stitch with the yarn in front.

At the beginning of the next row, knit the slipped stitch.

This will create a nice even edge and eliminates the "bumps" created by garter stitch edges.

2. A Ruler at Your Fingertips

Need to measure your knitting on the fly?

Get your finger involved!

The space between your index finger and the join is roughly one inch.

So, the next time you need to measure by the inch, whip out your

finger and get measuring!
