June 2023 Conference News:

Classes and Workshops for **June 2023 Conference** can be seen <u>here</u> - WOW! The entire conference brochure can be found here.

NOTE: The MAFA Board has voted to operate on a deficit budget for the next 2 years. The organization has more than sufficient funds in its accounts to do this and operating this way will help hold down conference fees at a time when costs for everything are escalating.

Early registration (that includes all FSW Guild members) begins February 4th. It can feel like a lottery - register early in the day to make sure you get the class that you want! The Keynote Speaker will be Suzy Ballinger. MAFA is working on live-streaming some of the public events at the conference.

There will also be a virtual mini conference following the in-person conference (July 8-9). This will be comprised of small, 2-3 hour classes and is intended for those cannot attend a conference in person.

The purpose of the fellowships is to help promote, expand and preserve fiber arts and to encourage the sharing of valuable information within the MAFA community and with the general public. KNITTING KNOTES

- 1. When reinforcing socks, if you can't find nylon filament for the heel and toe, you can use silk sewing thread.
- 2. When picking up stitches along the neck edge, to avoid loose stitches, pick up the first stitch as usual. Pick up the second stitch by yarning over with the working yarn and the tail. This will help keep tension on the first stitch, as well as securing the tail. Pick up the other stitches, as usual. On the next row, work the stitch with two loops as one.
- 3. Knit the sleeves of your sweater before the body. That way you can correct a gauge or pattern problem with fewer stitches to rip out. Also, you have a better chance of ending up with a finished sweater rather than a vest.

WEAVING WIDSOM

- 1. For quick conversion between yard and meters, remember that one meter is about 10% longer than one yard. For smaller units, four inches equal ten centimeters.
- 2. When weaving, if you cut off a sample, much warp can be saved by first throwing 3/4 " of tabby or the plainest weave possible. Then spread this 3/4 " with glue or Fray Chek thoroughly. Placing something under the weaving will protect the woven fabric below. Cut the warp, leaving this strip on the loom. When glue is dry, hold out the strip, tromp a tabby treadle and insert a dowel or narrow strip of wood. Then fasten this to the front apron securely every 6 inches or so. The amount of lost warp will be 3/4 " plus the dowel or wooden piece. This is much less than if you tied on again and the tension will be uniform.
- 3. When preparing finished flat pieces for storage, roll rather than fold. Creases tend to break down the fibers over long periods of time.
